The plan sets the AML extremely low at just 50-104 wild horses on 19,700 acres. Even at high AML, that's one horse for every 394 acres! This range is far too low to maintain a self-sustaining, genetically viable population of wild horses in the Territory.

I vigorously object to this plan and ask you to go back to the drawing board and do better. Wild horses are an iconic part of America, and deserve to live in peace without human interference. Your plan to exterminate them in order to allow more cattle grazing - on our public lands - is short-sighted and wrong.
