Comments: The plan sets the AML extremely low at just 50-104 wild horses on 19,700 acres. That's one horse for every 394 acres and far too low to maintain genetic viability of the wild horsed in the Territory.

If fertility control is to be used PZP has over 30 years been proven to be the safest and most effective method of controlling herd populations.

IUDs have not been proven humane or effective in wild, free roaming herds and should not be used and further analysis ended. This is a waste of taxpayers dollars.

Sitgreaves National Forest horses are endangered by those who want them removed from the forest by using bullets. This is unacceptable. The Heber wild horses have been the target of illegal hunting since 2018. The Forest Service must work harder to protect these federally protected wild horses from harm and to find the person(s) responsible.
