This plan sets the level at 50-104 horses which would work out at 1 horse per 394 acres. This must make every effort is far too low to maintain a genetically viable population.

The Forest Service must reduce livestock in the territory to give wild horses their fair share of the land. Also the service must make every effort to relocate the horses that were outside the territory boundary back inside said boundary.

The Heber wild horses have been the target of illegal hunting since 2018. The Forest Service must make every effort to find the perpetrators and to protect these federally protected horses.

If removals must occur they should be done first and over time by bait trapping to meet the adoption demand and not to add to the thousands of wild horses already in holding facilities across the country
