Comments: If there ever was a time to revise the management rules for domestic livestock grazing on national forest lands in favor of wildlife habitat conservation vs. resource extraction and destruction - now is the time. Unfortunately, the Draft proposals for grazing go in the wrong direction and should not be implemented.

Domestic livestock Allotments that have been retired or are currently vacant should be PERMANENTLY RETIRED in favor of use by native wildlife.
