Comments: Livestock grazing is fundamentally at odds with the mandate of the Wilderness Act that Wilderness remain "untrammeled." Livestock grazing on National Forest degrades our public lands. Impacts from grazing must be fully examined. Any revisions to Forest Service grazing policies must comply with federal laws, including the National Environmental Policy Act. The FS should not return grazing to the excessive levels permitted in the 1960s. This leftover Trump administration proposal to increase grazing would not only fuel livestock grazing's contribution to the climate and biodiversity crises, but runs directly counter to the Biden Administration's 30x30 land conservation agenda by sacrificing what could be protected lands to the commercial livestock industry. The Forest Service must do the right thing for Wilderness by dropping its proposed Rangeland Management Directives. The Forest Service must amend its directives and undertake a more comprehensive rulemaking process that complies with the National Environmental Policy Act.
