Comments: In SERVICE to our FORESTS, I want to comment on invasive bovine species on our public lands and your proposed Rangeland Management Directives:

The Wilderness Act states that Wilderness is 'untrammled'. What part of cow and sheep grazing is NOT trammeling Wilderness? NO grazing rights on Wilderness. Period.

Grazing on public lands degrades OUR lands. I have hiked to the remotest headwaters in the Sierra Nevada, only to find cow dung littered all over the springs, making the entire stream undrinkable.
