Comments: The Rangeland Management Directives contradicts the mandate of the Wilderness Act which says that Wilderness remain "untrammeled." Instead of increasing livestock grazing on public lands, the agency should allow vacant allotments to be permanently closed and should protect Wilderness, other public lands, and wildlife, including endangered species, by limiting, rather than increasing, inappropriate livestock grazing in National Forests.
