Comments: I strongly oppose updating the Rangeland management directives to make it easier to increase grazing and to continue allowing livestock to trammel all over public lands, particularly wilderness areas. The Mountain West clearly cannot handle the amount of grazing that is already available to ranchers. They are already reaping many benefits with very drawbacks given the cushy relationship between USFS and ranchers. The rules should be updated to bring them more in line with the science, which says historic mega-droughts are increasing and cattle, and other livestock are contributing more to the climate and biodiversity crisis we are already facing. The rules should NEVER allow LLCs to obtain grazing rights that were meant to stay within families. LLCs are already shady and obfuscated enough. Given the rangeland management rules already receive little attention, more dark dealing should never make this easier. USFS rules should be in place to benefit ALL the animals that live on the land and not just those humans deem reasonable or inoffensive (e.g., cattle).
