Comments: I have witnessed livestock grazing on National Forests, causing erosion, vegetation damage, alteration of ecosystems - especially for endangered species, in the western states. The impacts of the proposed changes by the Forest Service need to be examined in a transparent public process that complies with established federal law and NEPA. Public lands belong to the citizens of this country, not agencies that propose special treatment for ranchers and/or extractive interests. Protecting endangered and threatened species should be the overriding concern when proposing changes in policy that affect public lands. The legal, ethical, and financial responsibility for damage to public lands and endangered or threatened species has to be included in any permitted use for grazing.
