Comments: The direction the Forest Service has been taking in the past years regarding grazing is discouraging. Permitted numbers are almost always increased in AMP's and the number of taxpayer paid range infrastructure is, to be frank, quite staggering. The mindset seems to be more cattle grazing at any cost, including in wilderness areas where grazing has not been allowed for years due to negative impacts in the past. To see this amount of deference in the face of increasing and prolonged drought seems very shortsighted. The priority for the Forest Service should be anticipating impacts from climate change and making the adjustments on the ground in advance of what we know is coming. Riparian areas, uplands and the many species that depend on them will need increasing protections, not more cattle.
