## THE WILD FREE-ROAMING HORSES AND BURROS ACT OF 1971 states:

"All management activities shall be at the minimal feasible level" The Heber wild horses must not be rounded up as leaving an AML of 50-104 wild horses is not a genetically viable number. PZP or any fertility control must not be used as there is no proven overpopulation. The WFRH&B Act mandated wild horses be protected and preserved but this plan does not do that and is illegal and will cause the extinction of the historical Heber wild horses.

Expand the current designated HWHT to include the entire 818,651 acres of the Sitgreaves National Forest, the way it should be. AML, forage allocation, and everything else related to the Heber herd should be based on the "territorial habitat limits". The Sitgreaves National Forest is where the Heber wild horses have been historically known to use as their territorial habitat limits. Remove all the fencing.

Remove cattle as they cause erosion, destroy young trees and pollute water with E.coli.

Manage the Heber wild horses as a self-sustaining population . Do not use any kind of fertility control. Stop the roundup and removals. I support the No Action Alternative.
