I believe the Rangeland Management Directives have the potential to drastically affect millions of acres of public land, including Wilderness, where livestock grazing is fundamentally at odds with the mandate of the Wilderness Act.

Livestock grazing on National Forests, including millions of acres of Wilderness, vastly degrades our public lands. Impacts from grazing need to be fully examined and addressed through a transparent, public process that complies with federal laws, including the National Environmental Policy Act.

The recovery of imperiled or threatened species needs to be prioritized on National Forests and livestock grazing managed so as not to jeopardize species' recovery.

The Forest Service must do the right thing for Wilderness, other public lands, and wildlife by dropping its proposed Rangeland Management Directives.
