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Comments: After reading other comments I would like to add that I think that the TOF has done a good job of informing winter users which trails are available for non-paying use by the public including snowshoers, pedestrians and dog walkers. For those that question why the entire area including groomed winter trails may not be open to the public and why there are No Trespassing signs on trails, etc., placed in strategic places, I would suggest that the Nordic skiers who pay to use the FNC do so in expectation of adequate grooming of the trails at the FNC as well as the ability to ski without encountering pedestrians, dog walkers, snowshoers, etc., who may not be aware of trail etiquette and who may, unknowingly, disturb the grooming that Nordic skiers expect and PAY for. I know this seems trivial to non-Nordic skiers who want to use the trail system but it is the whole reason that we have groomed Nordic ski areas to begin with. Also, having had several encounters with dogs who were not in control of their owners per Summit County leash laws it is important that dogs be kept off of the FNC groomed trails aside from the rec path which is open to all users.
