Thanks for this exhaustive presentation. While I enjoyed the old days when I could walk in to Tamolich pool and visit it undisturbed by others, I know those days are gone unless I visit "off season".

I generally like your plan, especially moving the trail to the east side, the future option of limiting the numbers who can access the pool at a particular time, the video feed to the office to help monitor use, the emergency access improvement, and the ban on swimming and diving.

I see the proposed trail has a switchback portion and that you propose as much universal access as possible. These two situations seem to be incompatible. While I support universal access especially to a possible overlook site of the river, I hope that your desire to provide universal access will not result in excessive altering of the natural terrain.

I assume that the new trail system will not allow bicycles or motorized skateboards and wheels. Your past construction of the bicycle bypass near the old trail prevented a good deal of trail conflict and danger. As an avid bicyclist myself I very much appreciated that move. I suspect, though that bicyclists will attempt to visit the pool from the existing bicycle bypass.

Do you foresee this as a problem and how would you deal with an unauthorized connecting trail between the bike bypass and the pool?
