I own a house in Pinetop and have photos in the nearby forest land, less than $\frac{3}{4}$ of a mile from our house of unbranded, feral horse, there, undoubtedly consuming resources that wildlife would otherwise have access to!

I drive the 260 highway between Payon and Springerville, and would not want to hit a feral horse while traveling that route!

I hope your reduction starts right away so you can stop wasting money on a growing feral horse herd, and use it to benefit all the other wild animals and plants that should be there!
