Comments: This proposed (Devils Hens Nest) project needs some serious informed thinking. It is so devoid of information that it is difficult to comment on, but I have concerns:

- 1) A complete in-depth survey of the plant kingdoms that exist in this mostly intact forest should be performed -- trees and plants -- to inform our thinking.
- 2) A complete in-depth survey of the animal kingdoms should be undertaken to inform our thinking.
- 3) A complete in-depth survey of the watersheds involved in this area should be undertaken to be able to assess the damage that will surely occur, both to the quality of the streams, their inhabitants, and also the delicate intricate relationship it has to other components of this mostly intact forest, to inform our thinking.
