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I support the adoption of this restriction, and would support even lower durations of camping in one location. I am a frequent camper in National Forests. Too often, I find dispersed campsites occupied by what appears to be locals who park a camping rig in a location for long durations, and then only access it on weekends. I have observed camping rigs parked and unused for consecutive days at a time. Their actions tie up prime camping locations for those of us who only have a few days in an area to camp. Our Forests are for everyone in the nation, not just those who live a few hours away and want to park their camping rigs and use them as a weekend getaway. I would actually support a lower limit than 14 days for one location, I would suggest 5 for one location, and 14 days total in a 30 day period.
