I still hike some trails, though there are precious few that aren't overrun by cattle (stink, cowpies, fouled water, flies - ugh!). I support limited dispersed camping - but most spots occupied most of the time are well "established" by use, and many campers do not carry their own waste disposal system. More ugh. Do like BLM, and take those "dispersed" sites and make them official campsites - with portapotties. Limit camping within a certain distance of a road (like, 1/2 mile) to those sites and those sites only.
