There were areas were purple on the on the page 200 map that we're not in the designated inventory. And they were not there yet they're being showed his new designations so that was my question, there was a ring around from the West side around the Northwest side and then scattered around the white mountain wilderness there's several little blue purple splotches and some of those I can find on that map that they were in that designation so that was the nature of that comment. I do want to apologize; I have made a mistake yesterday on a radio broadcast and misread some of the some of the documents and how they would to be interpreted and the inventory that was selling and if you're designating, I think there's a good amount of discussing we can still have, but the whole report looks pretty good not to see everybody's worked on. Okay, I just more of a question to the previous I guess two individuals there that were that were hunters and we're talking about the end and the Lincoln a long time I haven't been I've only been here about 10 years now and I'm a little older, I think, than, than either of those gentlemen. Some of this wilderness even potentially that could be designated is pretty remote, as you know, okay you're out there hunting with your bow and your five miles from the edge of the forest, or the willow institute came until you kill an elk. Okay, the rules as they stand, the only way you get that out of there is with either of horses or mules or whatever. And if you don't have those good, healthy hope you have a lot of friends, because getting that animal out, going to be difficult. It's just I'm a hunter I'm a fisherman just like you guys, although I haven't hunted the big game like you all have, how do you handle that situation, are you ever going to get that animal out? It's five miles from your ability to get them down the road that's my only question. And I appreciate being given sense that.
