I am writing to you regarding your proposed plan to clear out through logging and cutting down both healthy and dead trees in our national forests. I am writing to you that your plan seems lacking/unclear as it doesn't reference wilderness anywhere and the maps you've provided are also unclear about whether wilderness designated areas are to be left alone - as they should be. To be clear, I would like offer the following:
