Complex, old-growth forests are vital to the life and survival of many woodland species. The habitats of the Northshore have already been altered significantly with tourism, building, and industry. Old-growth forests are rare and unique in Minnesota and are vital to support the lives of owls, martin, lynx, bobcat, moose, and much, much more. Even thinning such woodland and removing the complexities of the forest would destroy the habitat of such animals and push them out.
