I understand the trail is flagged but wildlife trails going in many directions can make a hiker get disoriented easily. I realize this is a big undertaking that would likely need to be done in stages. Initially, I would like to see just a clearer direction of the trail of the underdeveloped stretch, possibly by whacking bushes to make a roughly defined trail. Any improvements to this trail would be greatly appreciated.

Additionally, I've hiked the many trails around the Ward Lake area. With cruise ships docking nearby, I hope the Forest Service will continue the practice of not allowing commercialized hiking tours in the area.
