I am personally opposed to such a project as I do not think we need to blanket all of our lands with perfect cell coverage and know a lot of emergency first responders that agree with me. With that said, and assuming there is not really a way to prevent such a project from happening I want to propose a very important addition to this project, and that is funds to rehab the existing historic fire lookout on this site. This is the last remaining fire lookout in the Naches Ranger District and has fallen into disrepair in the last 10 years despite a few dedicated volunteers who fixed the roof a few years back to prevent further interior water damage. This is partially because access by vehicle to it is rather difficult but this project would, by necessity for the construction equipment, lead to improved road access so all it would take is some funds and a group of volunteers to rehabilitate the lookout into a historic functioning rental like many others around the West which through the rental program generate money for their own upkeep while keeping 'eyes-on-the site' rather than a structure left alone to whoever wants to vandalize it. I am a local architect (Yakima) and fire lookout enthusiast that has rented and slept in 26 different fire lookouts around the west so far and would love to be a part of the volunteer rehabilitation of jump off lookout at this site.
