2. The scoping notice says these areas will be avoided:

2C2 Eligible Wild and Scenic Rivers,

1A Designated Wilderness,

1B Recommended Wilderness.

We recommend to expand this list to include:

Potential Wilderness Areas Inventoried Roadless Areas Special Biological Areas Recommended National Scenic Area (Shenandoah Mountain NSA)

- 3.We request that measures be taken to minimize temporary impacts to trailheads, campgrounds, picnic areas, scenic overlooks, and parking areas.
- 4.Please explain what process will be defined to monitor ongoing maintenance and repair/service activities after initial installation.
- 5. We recommend that the FS announce on their web site a schedule of work areas and road or trail closures.
- 6.Recommend that this scoping letter be more strictly defined to be restricted to road right-of-ways. Due to the unique nature of utility right-of-ways and usually difficult and/or sensitive terrain, fiber optic installations in utility right-of-ways should be individually reviewed and assessed in accordance with a specific NEPA process.
- 7.On page 4, there is mention of ground disturbing actitivies in previously disturbed road and trail right-of-ways. The intention for trails may be that only crossings are allowed, but it is not clear. Recommend that this be clarified to emphasize that trail right-of-ways may not be used to install fiber. Alternatively, it appears that the word "trail" should be replaced with "utility" to be consistent with the rest of the document.
