Where the spruce grow they create and harbor habitat for some pretty special orchids of which, all told there are at least 18 separate species. So to clear cut the spruce is to remove all of that. Also where spruce grow, on those north facing slopes are found many springs and seeps which also contribute to that rare ecosystem but which is also especially sensitive to the bulldozing machinery used to enter, cut and haul the trees.
