In particular, I take concern with the proposed new OHV routes: Warm Springs Canyon additions & Denchmark Roadless Area addition. These new route proposals would degrade inventoried roadless areas, increase motorized traffic at the Wilderness boundary, and have significant impacts to Wild and Scenic eligible rivers, unique geologic areas, and existing non-motorized recreation.
