On September 7, 2020, the Beachie Creek and Lionshead Wildfires swept through the Santiam Canyon causing unprecedented damage in our communities. The fires caused significant damage to many trees in the fire's path. The Forest Service is proposing to fall fire-killed and injured trees to reduce risk and ultimately restore access to and throughout the burned area. They have released the 2020 Fire Affected Road System Risk Reeducation Project Environmental Assessment (EA). The EA is open for public comment starting June 17 and lasting 30 days.
