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Comments: I am writing to urge you to allow natural recovery at Cube Cove.

As you are aware, Cube Cove is healing from the damage caused by past logging, roads, and associated impacts. The Forest Service's massive "restoration" program using heavy equipment is inappropriate for the Kootznoowoo Wilderness.

The FS's plan violates the letter and spirit of the Wilderness Act-through its extensive use of chainsaws, helicopters, motor vehicles, and other motorized equipment, plus tree cutting, placing woody debris in riparian areas, and other proposed actions.

This sort of invasive equipment is extremely disruptive to the wildlife living in this Wilderness area.

Ideally, the area should be allowed to fully recover on its own by allowing time and natural processes to heal past damage. At the very least, the Forest Service needs to analyze a wilderness-compatible plan if it chooses active restoration, such as one that uses non-motorized hand tools rather than chainsaws and heavy equipment.

Reclaimed roads should not be converted to trails. If the agency does convert them, though, it must mitigate the impacts on wildlife from increased human use.

The wildlife in this area needs protection. The least invasion by humans, the better.
