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Comments: Cube Cove is healing from the damage caused by past logging, roads, and associated human impact. The Forest Service's proposed "restoration" program for the Kootznoowoo Wilderness sounds like a lot more of the same human disruption and destruction. The FS's plan violates the letter and spirit of the Wilderness Act-through its extensive use of chainsaws, helicopters, motor vehicles and heavy equipment. Increased tree and brush cutting will not improve riparian areas or other types of habitat. Ideally, the area should be allowed to fully recover on its own by allowing time and natural processes to heal past damage. At the least, the Forest Service needs to analyze a wilderness-compatible plan if it chooses active restoration, such as one that uses non-motorized hand tools and minimal human activity. Healing this land will not happen if the Forest Service emphasizes human needs over wildlife and habitat. Wildlife and plants are not served by recreational trails over old road beds.
