Comments: As a foresters' son who values the jobs and construction materials provided by logging, I am commenting to say we should certainly continue logging some areas of forest. However, it is crucial to the long term health of our forests (and thus our logging economy) that areas of large diameter trees (mature and old growth) are left. These areas are more resistent to fire, insect/disease infestations and climate change.
