Holland lake resides in the grizzly bear corridor. How will this increased development impact their habitat?

Loons reside on this lake. According to FWP, Montana has the largest population of common loons in the western United States with 72 territorial pairs. While the number of territorial pairs has fluctuated, the overall number of pairs has increased. The biggest threat to loons is human disturbance. An influx of tourism (tourists from out of state who do not understand how to respect the wildlife) to this lake will greatly disturb the loon population.

The safety of highway 83 and the road to Holland lake, under the stress of an influx of people.

The safety of the Holland falls trail, which as it stands is already a crowded trail, and crowded on the rocks that overlook the lake. What is the plan for the inevitable increase to traffic on this trail when a resort is built? It's not safe to have dozens of people up there at a time.

Emergency services, if there is an influx of tourism in the Seeley-Swan area, especially folks who are not normally doing outdoor sports and unfamiliar with the area, you are putting extra strain on the emergency services in the Seeley Swan.

Finally, I have concerns about the heritage of the 9 historic structures that will be demolished, and would like this to be investigated.
