Comments: I would like to add comments to my previous objection to the Holland Lake Lodge expansion. After attending yesterday's meeting in Condon MT I am more convinced than ever that this is not a good fit, POWDR's answers to the concern of the residents were evasive, to say the least, but the impacts on the Swan valley and its residents will be felt for years.

Key points: no evacuation plan in place for fire or other natural disaster. Evacuation of 200++ people down a very narrow 2 lane road is not feasible. Wildfires move too fast. Take a page from the Camp Fire in California that killed 85+ people. No way to evacuate. POWDR rep Stacey

Hutchinson tells us there will be a medic on property...all fire departments in that area are volunteer..This would put a terrible burden on those departments.

Also the tax burden on a small community that struggles with feeding families and paying mortgages if this goes through. Who is going to pay the cost of road upkeep, infrastructure that is not in place, added police force, and many other needed support people. Jobs are going unfilled all over the country right now..where will these new hires come from??

I know the average age of attendees in the meeting was retirement age or better but we have lived with the consequences of rash decisions before, we have learned hard lessons along the way.

I worry about the sustainability of POWDR representatives making promises they just cannot keep..And they made MANY....
