I oppose the proposed Holland Lake Lodge expansion on public land just outside of the Bob Marshall Wilderness and recommended wilderness, which would negatively impact Wilderness, wildlife, and public use of national forest land that belongs to all of us.

I especially strongly oppose the use of a Categorical Exclusion (CE) to determine the environmental report for this huge, landscape altering proposed project. This is flat the WRONG way to use CE's. I request a full EIS to be conducted in order to fully review potential environmental issues including but not limited to: air and water degradation, conflicts with endangered species protections, conflict with adjoining Wilderness lands and sacred grounds to Native American tribes.

The Forest Service (FS) should prepare an environmental impact statement that considers the full range of potential impacts at Holland Lake and the surrounding public lands, including the Bob Marshall Wilderness.
