Holland Lake at present has an acceptable level of recreational activity.

Holland Lake would be for ever changed, in a negative way, if the proposed development is allowed to proceed.

The expansion would have a negative impact on wildlife such as grizzly bear, mountain lions, and wolverines that live in the nearby mountains and traverse near the lake.

The increase traffic would adversely affect wildlife in this corridor.

Loons and other aquatic birds would be disturbed in their nesting activity due to increase traffic on the lake.

Even though the corporation plans water treatment facility upgrades, water quality will decrease in this pristine lake.

The ripple effect the proposed development would affect much of the Seeley Lake to Condon corridor. This is critical habitat for many forms of wildlife.

This project would be one more impact in the cumulative destruction of one of the great ecosystems in the Northern Rockies.
