Comments: I have worked for the USFS as a Field Technician in Silviculture, Watershed and Hydrology, Fire and Fuels Management. I have inspected contracts of site prep in Fire and Fuels Management, in Silviculture for thinning projects, planting and reforestation of clear cuts and select cutting, site prep contracts for seeding and rehabilitation of clear cuts and select cuts. I have worked with the Forest Hydrologists in the field to rehab timber harvested areas in prevention of erosion and soils retention. I have been an inspector for Best Management Practices in Watershed and Hydrology.

It is my opinion that your Treatment Project #57353 is not acceptable.

The project should be withdrawn and an EIS prepared.

A reasonable range of alternatives have not been considered.

Consideration for wildlife such as: bears, moose, elk, wolverine and pine marten should be given priority here in the Greater Yellowstone Ecosystem.

NO NEW ROADS: Roads and skid trails are a primary cause of erosion, native plant species will be affected and decimated. Roads bring in recreational motorists, campers, hikers, cyclists and ORV use that will affect the ecosystem and native wildlife within and beyond the treatment area.
