Comments: I have not extensively investigated the number of trails that are in the Ochoco NF, though what is maintained I know is limited. I believe existing trails outside of wilderness areas should be maintained and enhanced to accommodate bikers and hikers. It would be nice to see a map of existing trails in the NF, which might allow for increased awareness and use, which could disperse visitors versus a concentrated trail system. However, I feel that as populations increase, and recreation use increases, the ability to disperse visitors becomes challenging. It's also inevitable that more people will want to experience serene areas. I think those that live on Wild Cat Rd do not accept that and are unwilling to make a compromise. Increased vehicle traffic seems to be a bigger issue than the bike trails. Parking lots up high for shuttling takes away from the experience that many bikers enjoy. That's working to get to the top, not using a vehicle. This also lowers the number of parking lots. I believe these projects should be low impact. Hand dug trails, closing roads and building trails on those roads, or connecting them might be a good way to limit the impact on wildlife. Also, is Lemon Gulch the only option?
