Undisclosed numbers of trucks loaded with chemicals will be passing through McCall, either on the bypass which crosses the North Fork of the Payette, or through downtown, on the banks of our lake. Any accident, and historically there have been with logging trucks dumping their loads downtown, would ruin our economy and quality of life here. And who would pay? As Perpetua, bears no responsibility beyond the Warm Lake road, most likely the local taxpayers would need to pay. We are struggling to maintain our present roads. We can not support the mine's trucking activities, especially with toxic loads. Therefore I ask the Forest Service to Not approve this mine, but to choose the No Action Alternative.
