Comments: Thanks for letting me comment on this issue. The Stibnite Gold project puts not only the famed Frank Church-River of No Return Wilderness at risk but also the East Fork of the South Fork of the Salmon River and endangered species such as salmon, steelhead, and bull trout.

Under the preferred alternative, road construction and mining operations would cause serious impacts to the River of no Return Wilderness, including noise audible from a nearly 2-mile radius, wildlife disturbance and displacement, increased access to and activity in what are now quiet and lightly-visited places in the wilderness, and sediment pollution in streams within wilderness. The wilderness evaluation erroneously down plays these impacts
