I feel as though I've barely gotten to explore the vast acreage of public parks and foot trails that this state has to offer, but I already feel that I, like most Vermonters, have a responsibility to protect and treasure it. The new proposal to cut down nearly 12,000 acres of forest that is both beautiful and highly productive is very alarming to me. A large part of the area proposed for logging is defined as mature or old growth, and logging of any old growth forests would be violating Executive Order 14072, signed by Joe Biden.
