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Comments: Based on photographs of the area, the damage that has been done is pretty mind-boggling. It's hard for me to imagine that human efforts can do much to truly restore this area. Over time, nature will surely do her own thing for eroding and re-vegetating.

In the meantime, it seems to me that efforts should have some focus on protecting the various downstream areas from major debris flows. The map shows major washes leading to the Santa Cruz River and the Nogales area, which sadly has a poor record of debris flows and sewage flows, which appear to me to be direct results of environmental injustice.

I believe the Army Corps of Engineers was supposed to have overseen the border wall construction. If true, they need to come forward with whatever their plans were for "engineering" this destruction so that down gradient communities would not be overwhelmed with debris.

If the Army Corps had plans that were not followed, then the contractor should be called to account for any failure and made to pay for remediation, if warranted. The taxpayer has had to pay for this destruction and now it seems likely that the taxpayer will be paying for remediation. Can the scoping address whether or not the destruction and construction followed appropriate guidance from the Army Corps of Engineers?
