Comments: I am avid horse riding enthusiast and Turkey Creek is my absolute favorite trail for horse riding. I have shared this trail amicably for years with many other users including outfitters, atv-ers, hikers and backpackers. However, I have been experiencing increasing conflicts with mountain bikers that have been riding fast and are impatient to trail etiquette causing dangerous situations for myself and my horse. However, I absolutely see the interest and need for more mountain biking trails in the area and value the work that Dust 2 does in order to build trails and educate users regarding safe and proper trail etiquette. My solution would be to create a few trails for horses in which mountain bikes are not allowed. Another possible solution could be to create a trail system focused on mountain bikes but then to close Turkey Creek trail to mountain bikes as they will have their own trail system in the area. Also, I would like to see the USFS take a more active role in educating trail rules and etiquette. Increased education and enforcement reduces conflict and benefits all trail users.

Additionally, as a long time resident I can absolutely see the need for a county gravel pit as I too am tired of potholes. I do not feel informed enough at this time in order to have an opinion about the location of the gravel pit. If the gravel pit does indeed form at Jackson Mountain I would propose that the roads shared between gravel trucks and other users be widened for the safety of all. In particular, I am worried about the safety of sharing narrow roads with limited visibility while pulling a horse trailer.
