Comments: I am strongly opposed to the Forest Service's proposal to log the Telephone Gap area.

The fragile characteristic of this area should not be stressed with road building machinery, logging trucks, and any other sort of vehicular traffic that supports a logging operation.

I don't see any benefits to this proposal, but I do see a lot of negatives. Here is a list of just what I can think of:
