Comments: While logging is an important aspect to Vermont's economy, so is clean water, clean air, in-tact landscapes. We cannot have irresponsible logging within our state. With challenges already being faced in our watersheds with increased eutrophication due to increased storm water runoff and warmer weather from climate change we cannot afford to lose any more valuable forest to logging. Medium and old growth forests are a rare commodity in Vermont due to extensive logging in the industrial era and colonial days.
