There are so many reasons why this logging must be stopped, but I think they are captured in other people's comments.

I just want to share a brief timeline.

The current Forest Plan was adopted in 2006. That was 17 years ago.

The Paris Agreement was signed in 2015. It says "This Agreement...aims to strengthen the global response to the threat of climate change...by holding the increase in the global average temperature to well below 2°C above pre-industrial levels and pursuing efforts to limit the temperature increase to 1.5°C above pre-industrial levels, recognizing that this would significantly reduce the risks and impacts of climate change."

The Paris Agreement was signed 9 years after the current Forest Plan.

The Paris Agreement was signed 8 years ago.

The most recent United Nations Emissions Gap Report was released on October 27, 2022. It states that "...the international community is falling far short of the Paris goals, with no credible pathway to 1.5°C in place. Only an urgent system-wide transformation can avoid climate disaster."

The 2006 Forest Plan is laughably outdated.

Moving forward in 2023 using a document produced in 2006 is absurd.

Cancel the project.
