Comments: Please Avoid Clearcutting and Road Construction at River Complex

Dear Daniel Fenstermacher,

Hello!

Just in case you are considering clear-cutting, please remember that you too, and your family and friends, love eating salmon and other fish, are proud of our western wonderland, and that you also hope that your family's future generations will want to experience and revel in the beauty of our magic National Forests, the serene woodlands with their animal world, their old-growth trees, the pristine and clear rivers, streams and lakes. Please consider these facts BEFORE you decide on logging in these intact ecosystems.

I would like to add my voice to those who are concerned about the post-fire logging plans for the Taylor Creek area in the River Complex fire salvage proposal. Many of the proposed logging units near the Trinity-Alps Wilderness are located on steep slopes in a Late Successional Reserve in which clearcutting, road construction and conifer plantation establishment are inappropriate.

Instead of salvage logging backcountry wildlands in the headwaters of the Salmon River, please consider focusing project activities on roadside hazard treatments and on the Wildland Urban Interface zone for the Scott Valley.

In my opinion the Taylor Creek Late Successional Reserve is an inappropriate place for post-fire clearcut logging, new logging road construction, machine slash piling, and conifer plantation establishment.
