I am writing to express my concerns regarding the Golden Crest Exploration Drilling Project as outlined in the Draft Environmental Assessment (EA) dated May 10, 2023. While I appreciate the transparency provided in the EA, I believe there are significant potential environmental and social impacts that may not have been adequately addressed.

Ecological Impact: While the drilling is proposed to take place in previously disturbed areas, the operation's scale and duration could further degrade these sites, affecting the local fauna and flora. The Black Hills National Forest is home to a diverse range of species, some of which are likely already experiencing stress due to past disturbances. Sustainable Alternatives: There are more sustainable ways to boost local economies and create job opportunities, such as investing in renewable energy, eco-tourism, or reforestation projects. These alternatives could provide economic benefits without causing significant environmental harm.

Cultural Impact: The Black Hills are of great cultural significance to the indigenous peoples of this region. Any additional disturbances or potential degradation of the land should be avoided to respect and preserve these cultural sites and values.

In light of these concerns, I strongly urge the Northern Hills Ranger District to reconsider the Golden Crest Exploration Drilling Project. There are numerous potential environmental, social, and cultural impacts that must be weighed against the short-term economic benefits the project may bring.
