Comments: I was born in the southern Black Hills and now live in the northern Black Hills. I am sincerely concerned about Solitario Zinc's proposal for exploratory mining. The Forest Service needs to complete a full environmental impact statement.

\* Mining geologists tell us that exploratory mining is safe but there are no guarantees. An aquifer can be punctured.
