It would be ecologically beneficial for wildlife, water and soil to leave these trees. Arapaho Roosevelt is way behind on dealing with burning slash piles. These will probably sit around becoming a fire hazard. When they do get burned you will literally be burning insects and other wildlife. You also demonstrate zero interest in correcting illegal trails and roads which are often heavily used (as in the St. Vrain Sheep Mt. RNA area by bikers and motorized vehicles. And here come the e-bikes. Best not create ANY new access which will damage habitat and increase fire danger when you don't educate about these illegalities and refuse to manage them. Entering this intact area will disturb wildlife (I recently observed a chainsaw induced elk cow and calf stampede). Leave this biodiverse area to evolve naturally. Salvage logging isn't environmentally sound. Just say no to Greenman.
