Comments: By overlooking or ignoring the law of unintended consequences, I think you are making several critical mistakes which will result in more injuries to inexperienced skiers and less enjoyment for expert skiers. 1. The Alta Chutes. They are presently forbidding enough to keep MOST inexperienced skiers out of them. But if you take out the rocks from 1 and 3, and open 2 and create a 4th, they will LOOK easier, and attract intermediate skiers to them, further congesting Pepi's Ridge, but they will actually still be steep. These chutes are some of the few remaining north facing runs that haven't been "groomed" beyond nature. Let's keep them as they are. 2. Hobacks egress. While you think you are creating more safety with an intermediate exit, again, you will be attracting more skiers to an area in which they don't belong, while chopping up the North Woods, and creating innumerable opportunities for crashes between guests, while ruining one of the last untouched glens on the mountain. 3. Placement and size of the new Sublette chair. I agree that the serpentine for that chair should be moved uphill, but think how the people speeding down from R Trail will access it. And if it is a six person chair and you move the food shack up there above the tree island, you will create further congestion and more opportunities for accidents and hot tempers and a less "Jackson Hole" experience. These ideas all have the right intentions behind them, but like the extra traffic lane intended to reduce congestion which ends up just creating more traffic, I think they will result in a worse experience for the guests.
