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Comments: As designated wilderness area, the top goal of the High Uintas Wilderness area management has to be the protection of the natural biodiversity. The grazing of cattle and sheep risks the deterioration of water resources and also increases the risk of potential contamination of the natural fauna by disease vectors of the domesticated species. Additionally, the continued permitting of grazing domesticated sheep will make it impossible for the bighorn sheep to recover as they should in this wilderness area. Not only will the bighorn sheep be disadvantaged by the grazing, but it will also push plans to curtail predators of the sheep which again violates the purpose of the wilderness designation. A cessation of all grazing would be the best solution, but if that is not feasible, grazing permits must be clearly evaluated that they will allow the natural species to thrive and not be negatively impacted.
